## How to Print and Fold your Passport to History

## To print on one piece of paper (two-sided):

Print pages 3 and 4 of this document on one  $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" (letter-sized) sheet of paper.

- Print "two-sided" on both sides of the paper.
- Be sure to print at 100% size (do not "scale").

Cut the paper horizontally. (Step 1)

Layer the pages numerically and fold both in half, vertically. (Step 2)

Staple the spine of your Passport! (Step 3)

## OR to print on two pieces of paper (one-sided):

Print pages 3 and 4 of this document on two  $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" (letter-sized) sheets of paper.


• Be sure to print at 100% size (do not "scale").


Cut both pages in half, horizontally. (Step 1)


Fold pages numbered **3 1 & 6 3** away from you. Fold pages **2 7** and **4 5** towards you. **(Step 2)** 

Layer the pages numerically, and staple the spine of your Passport. (Step 3)


If you like, glue or tape the blank pages together!






