2020 Annual Report

A Mission to Preserve, Promote and Educate

The Friends of Washington Crossing Park shares the powerful story of General George Washington's daring crossing of the Delaware River on Christmas night 1776 and interprets its ongoing impact on world history for both today's citizens and future generations.

Through fundraising, the generous support of our donors and members, and our partnership with the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, we are able to maintain and sustain this significant historic site and welcome thousands of schoolchildren, families, individuals, and groups every year.



New Program Development

- In the early Spring, park attendance increased by 60 percent.
- In lieu of in-person programs, we innovatively adapted our current school programs offerings for virtual and at-home education. These programs included free downloadable content, video presentation of colonial craft & trade demonstrations, interactive lesson plans, and traveling chests.
- Inspired by our Colonial Days Summer Camp, our new "Camp in a Box" program was launched in the fall. Designed to bring the park's history home for kids, the box contains supplies and instructions for over 20 history themed activities easily done at home.
- Our lecture series and book club became virtual allowing us to expand our audience to history lovers from across the US. In 2020 the lecture series attracted a record high of 515 virtual attendees with an additional 800 views of the recordings on YouTube.
- The Hibbs House Kitchen Garden thrived during its first full year of seasonal planting as an outdoor classroom and recreational space.
- The Thompson-Neely Grist Mill ground 8,000 pounds of wheat and corn into flour and corn meal to be sold as a fundraiser for the park.
- We offered a video presentation of the 68th Annual Crossing Reenactment that debuted on YouTube and Facebook on Christmas Day. The video has generated over 23,000 views.

- We launched a successful giving campaign in support of our resident flock at the Thompson-Neely Farmstead. Our "Sponsor A Sheep" campaign raised over \$15,000 to support their daily needs, such as food and veterinarian costs.
- Through a new partnership with Delaware Valley University, we offered interactive and educational Zoom programming for students. As part of the new partnership, we will be hosting our "Colonial Days Summer Camp" program at Delaware Valley University in Summer 2021.
- Contracts were awarded for the \$8.7-million capital project which includes the rehabilitation of 11 historic buildings and structures on site. The project will not only help preserve our historic buildings, but prepare the park for the Semiquincentennial celebrations in 2026.
